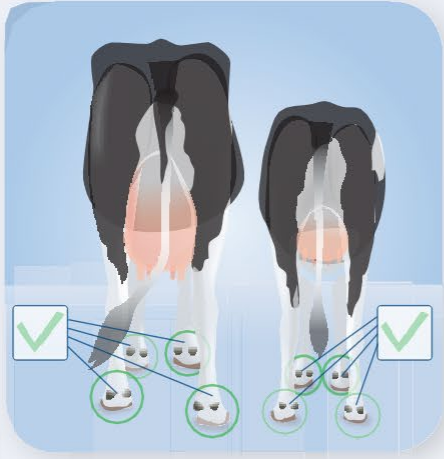
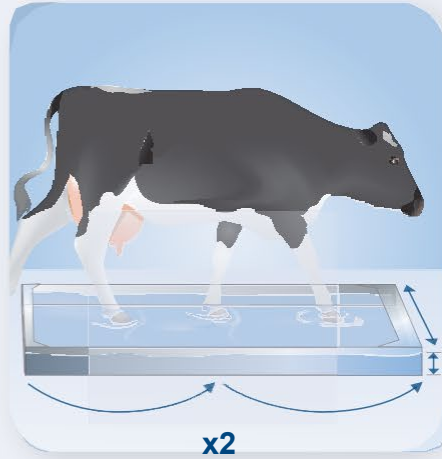


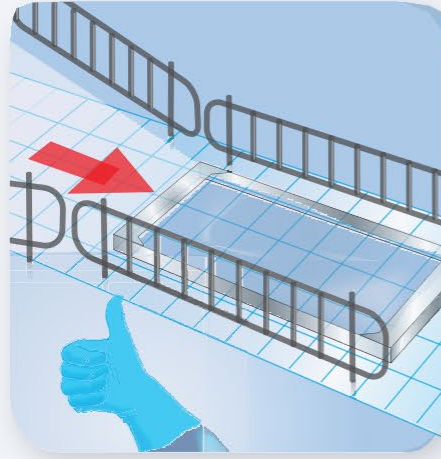
Sorkanhoidon 10 kultaista sääntöä

2. Käytä oikean-kokoista sorkkakylpyallasta



3. Aseta sorkkakylpy oikeaan paikkaan



4. Aloita puhtaalla sorkkakylvyllä



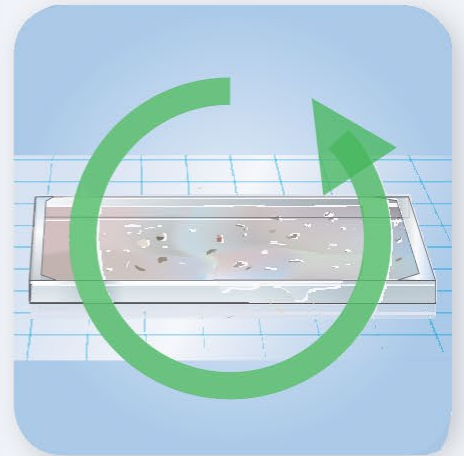
5. Käytä vain hyväksytyjä tuotteita



6. Annostele tuotteet oikein



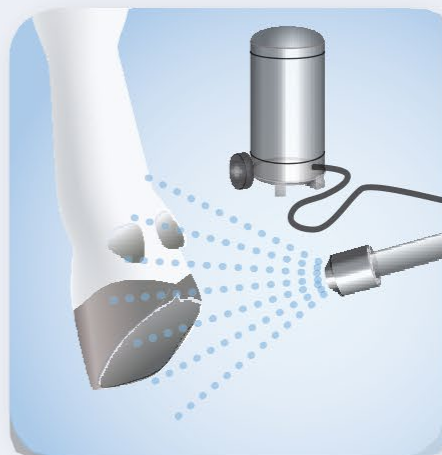
7. Puhdista sorkat ennen desinfiointia



8. Vaihda sorkkakylpy riittävän usein



9. Toista käsittely säännöllisesti

Sorkanhoidon 10 kultaista sääntöä

– *in detail*

1. Disinfect all hooves of all cows

- Front and rear hooves
- All cows including:
 - Milking cows
 - Dry cows
 - Heifers
 - Young stock

2. Use correctly-sized bath

- At least 2 strides long
- Deep enough to cover the dew claws (≥15cm)

3. Ensure correct emplacement

- No obstacles
- Well lit
- Guide the cows towards the bath so they cannot avoid it
- Clean and dry walking area after exit

4. Start with a clean bath

- Remove used solution and residual manure
- Clean the hoof bath before next usage

5. Use approved hoof disinfectant

- Use only registered, non-hazardous products with a proven efficacy

6. Use correct dosage

- Measure the volume of the bath
- Calculate the dosage according to label instructions
- Avoid under- or overdosing

7. Clean hooves before disinfection

- Pre-clean the hooves to optimize contact with the disinfecting solution
- Pre-cleaning will decrease the soiling and prolong the efficacy of the foot bath
- Always use a cleaning hoof bath in combination with a disinfecting hoof bath

8. Refresh solution regularly

- Refresh according to label instructions (approximately every 200 cows) or degree of soiling

9. Disinfect hooves regularly

- Disinfect hooves at least 1 time per week
- A standard of 3 disinfections per week is advised
- Evaluate digital dermatitis prevalence regularly and adjust frequency if needed

10. Spray hooves if there is no bath

- If usage of a hoof bath is not possible, consider spraying of the hooves as an alternative
- Clean hooves before spraying with disinfectant
- Thoroughly cover the entire target area (heel bulb + interdigital space)



Always use disposable gloves
– always ensure disposable gloves are clean
